

A NOTE FROM MRS HEFFER

This week our virtue focus has been 'GOOD LISTENING':



HEALTH AND SAFETY TEAM – Over the next few weeks, the school will be looking to appoint a number of pupils that will become part of a Health and Safety team working with our Health and Safety Governor and Headteacher to address any concerns over the safety of our pupils. This will include developing a group of Junior Traffic Wardens in an attempt to make the roads and carpark safer for our pupils. Please see message below relating to this ongoing issue.

URGENT MESSAGE: PLEASE DO NOT PARK ON THE ZIG ZAGS OUTSIDE OF SCHOOL. Parents have approached us with information and photos of cars parking outside of school on the zig zags. The habit of parking on the zig zags is not fair to other parents and children as it means that they cannot get in to school safely. There is parking further down the road — please use it rather than put our child's safety at risk. You know it makes sense!

NEW FACES AROUND SCHOOL — Over the next two weeks leading up to half term, Mr Anderson will be enjoying some time with the new arrival during his two week paternity leave. During this time, Mrs Kate Evans, a very experienced EYFS/Year 1 teacher, will be teaching in Puffins. At present we also have two student teachers based at our school for two days a week on Mondays and Tuesdays up until half term. Miss Holly Power-Brown is based in Puffins and Miss Rosalind Pitt is based in Kingfishers. After half term, Miss Pitt will continue her student teacher training in Kingfishers and will be working alongside Miss Shaile for five days a week until the end of term. We are always very keen to continue to support the development of future teachers where staff at our school can share their skills.
