Mrs Wendy Teasdale (see picture) who is at present, a teacher at Archbishop Benson School in Truro, will be joining our team. She will be popping in to spend more time with the children as the year progresses and will no doubt, become a familiar face at several of our forthcoming events between now and the end of term.



**COUNTY MUSIC FESTIVAL ENTRIES** – The children in the **choir** have been given lyrics to learn over the half term in preparation for the competition. The choir will be performing on **Tuesday**, **14**<sup>th</sup> **March at 9.30am**. They will be competing against 5 other schools as part of this competition. You may also be aware that we have decided to enter the whole of **Year 3** into the choral speaking this year and Mr Collett has been working very hard with the children to get them ready for the set piece they will perform. The choral speaking will take place on **Monday**, **13**<sup>th</sup> **March at 2.35pm**. The Year 3 group will be competing against two other schools in this event. Pupils taking part in solo competitions or small groups will receive their dates and times for their performance on individual letters. Please could I ask that those competing in the individual poetry recital bring copies of their chosen poem to school after half term to enable us to work with them. A letter outlining any final arrangements for the competition entries will be sent out closer to the date. Thank you.

**YEAR SIX ARE FULL STEAM AHEAD WITH THEIR PLANS FOR IMPROVEMENT** – As part of the work on Pupil Voice, our Swifts have been focusing, this term, on developing safer havens for birds, hedgehogs and fish by working on ideas on how to further develop the pond area.
