INSPIRATIONAL DOMESDAY PROJECT! - Last week also saw the launch of the Perranwell Domesday Project which our Chair of Governors, Mr Colin Bridges has been heavily involved in its promotion. On Tuesday, last week, Mr Bridges did an inspirational presentation explaining how the Domesday project would work. Mrs Lea and Miss Shaile were also present at the meeting and explained how the children would be involved in collating more historical evidence about the village. To give more parents and members of the community the opportunity to come to hear about this exciting venture, Mr Bridges has very kindly agreed to repeat this presentation on Wednesday, 17th June at 3.30pm and again at 6.30pm to enable more people to attend. This is something not to be missed! The Starlings have already had a wonderful workshop where local historians came to talk to the children about the history of the village and their local area. Having received an email from the visitors about the exceptional standard of behaviour from the Starlings, I was thrilled to be able to share this with the children during assembly this week when they shared what they had been up to. Photographs and information gathered by the community for the Domesday Project and the work the children will be doing about the history of the school and the village will be collated and presented on Monday, June 29th at the School's Open Day. This is a wonderful opportunity for those of you who are keen historians, photographers or simply just love your community and local area. Come along and find out what this exciting project is all about. We look forward to seeing you in the school hall on Wednesday, 17th June.

FABULOUS ARTS WEEK – Next week, as part of our preparation towards our Open Day and linked to the history of the village and the Domesday Project, the whole school will be involved in an arts week where the children will be creating pictures to represent different aspects of the village using the styles of their chosen famous artist to inspire the way in which they draw and paint. On Wednesday, the children will also be given the opportunity to work with Cathy Whitmore, a local dance instructor and teacher, who will develop dance routines with the children that will be performed during the course of our Open Day. It promises to be a very exciting and creative week!

WONDERLAND – The rehearsals for Alice in Wonderland are now well underway and the Year 6 are impressing us all with how quickly they are learning their lines and developing their 'curious' wonderland characters. The Starlings and Kingfishers have also started to learn dance routines as part of their involvement in the musical and the whole school has been heavily involved in learning the numerous and very eclectic mix of songs for the show. Props are being made, costumes are being created and we are very hopeful that the production will take place at the village hall where there

will be ample seating for the audience. Much of the costume making for the Starlings and the Kingfishers will take place in school as we are keen for the children to be involved in this process and enjoy being part of creating their own character. We will be sending all the KS2 children home with the lyrics of the songs to learn over the next few of weeks. This will be a ticketed performance and we have decided to make a small charge for the tickets in order to help raise funds for the school and to cover some of the basic costs of the hall hire etc. Tickets will be available as soon as dates and the use of the village hall have been confirmed.

It is going to be an exciting day for the whole family – bringing the community together to help raise funds and enjoy a culmination to the end of the Big Village Month.
