NEW ICT FUNDING – During the Summer term 2014, the school made an application for Belling Funding which is dedicated to supporting schools develop their teacher and pupil IT resources. Before half term, Mr Richard Belling visited our school and during his tour he noted the lack of interactive boards and the limited number of computers. As a result of our application and Mr Belling's visit, we have now received the exciting news that The Belling Trust have agreed to provide the school with a substantial amount of funding to enable the school to purchase 5 LED interactive screens (1 in each class) and a further 26 laptops with a mobile storage/charging unit. We hope to have the new equipment in place by the beginning of next term. We are very appreciative of the funding from the Belling Trust which aims to help as many Cornish schools as they can each year. This year only 3 schools were selected out of a large number that applied. We feel very lucky to be in a position to soon be able to provide cutting edge provision for our pupils.

NEW TEACHERS – You may now have heard the news that Miss Mackie will be leaving us at the end of this term to enable her and her family to relocate to Bristol where they will be closer to their relatives. We will be sad to see Miss Mackie leave and wish her all the very best for her and her family's future. As a result of having advertised for a KS2 post for our Year 3/4 class, we were in the very fortunate position to be able to appoint two new members of staff on the same day. We are thrilled to have Miss Sarah Shaile and Mrs Hannah Pallot join us in January. Miss Shaile will teach our Starlings and Mrs Pallot will teach our Swifts. Both teachers bring a wealth of KS2 teaching experience and a range of particular curriculum strengths. We have arranged for both new teachers to spend some time getting to know the children before the end of this term. I am confident that they will both be a great asset to our school. We look forward to Miss Shaile and her partner joining the staff quiz team this evening. Quite an initiation!
