PERRAN-AR-WORTHAL GET INTO THE TOP 2% OF ALL SCHOOLS IN THE COUNTRY!!! — Last week we were delighted to receive a letter from the Nick Gibb MP (Minister of State for School Reform) congratulating our school on achieving 100% pass rate in the Year 1 phonics screening test that took place during the Summer term 2015. An extract from the letter is below:

Dear Mrs Heffer

I am writing to convey my warmest congratulations to you, your staff and your pupils for the very high standard of achievement in the 2015 phonics screening check.

We want to ensure that every child develops a firm grasp of phonics which is why I was so delighted to see your results. With 100% of pupils at Perran-Ar-Worthal Community Primary School reaching or exceeding the pass mark in the check, your school is in the top 2% of all primary schools in the country.

This year's figures show that 99% pupils who reach or exceed the pass mark in the phonics check go on to achieve at least the expected standard in key stage 1 reading which underlines the importance of developing the ability to decode words effectively at an early age.

I am pleased to learn that you have ensured that all Year 1 children in your school have a firm foundation in reading, from which they can develop further and become increasingly fluent readers.

Thank you for your work in this vital area of a child's early education and congratulations again to you and your staff for your hard work and professionalism.
