CREATIVE COMMUNITY SCHOOL - This week has been no exception with all classes having enjoyed our creative arts week. In preparation for the school's Open Day, which will be taking place on Monday, 29<sup>th</sup> June from 1.30pm, each class has been creating pictures of village life in the style of famous artists they have studied. The results of their hard work will be displayed as an art gallery in the school hall for all to enjoy at our open day. On Wednesday, the children were treated to dance workshops with dance instructor and teacher, Cathy Whitmore. It was a privilege to see Cathy work with each class of children to create a routine that depicted village life and change. In addition to the gallery and dance items, some of the children will also be performing instrumental pieces; the Starlings will be sharing their displays of the work they have achieved through studying the history of the village; there will be a scholastic book fair on display; at 4pm the results of the Domesday Project will be presented in the school hall and we are all looking forward to the official unveiling of the 2015 Perran-ar-Worthal School Quilt created by Val Parker. A timetable of when events will be taking place will be sent home with next week's newsletter. The children look forward to sharing their wonderful work with you. We look forward to a busy day of sharing our work and celebrating our wonderful community.
