PLEASE HELP TO KEEP ALL OUR CHILDREN SAFE!

Over the last few weeks we have noticed the increase in traffic with all pupils returning to school on 8th March. With this increase, comes the increased risk of an accident occurring outside our school gates at the busy times of day.

We appreciate that it is difficult to find a parking space and it can be very tempting to pull in onto the zig zag lines to drop your child off at school. This is against the law for obvious reasons and we urge you to consider the safety of your child as well as the safety of all the children in our community when deciding where to park your car.

Parents have been expressing their concerns regarding the continued parking of some vehicles on the zig zag lines and below is an extract from a recent email from a parent that I feel may help to illustrate the reality of continuing to ignore these dangers.

'In my previous post on the road as an Emergency Paramedic I attended SEVERAL children who have been knocked down by passing cars because of this, one of which was just a bit older than my daughter and sustained significant head injuries. So I can say this both from a professional perspective, and from experience, that when a car parks in this position right outside a gate, any vehicle that passes will not have forward vision of a child, nor the child of a car, until they are upon them. Due to the height of a child, the mechanism of injury at a RTC is very different to that of an adult, as they can take the full force of an engine or worse are more likely to go under a car, as opposed to onto the bonnet or over a car, like an adult does – therefore sustaining more severe injuries at lower speeds.'
