IT'S SCIENCE WEEK NEXT WEEK!

British Science week is from the 8th-17th March 2019 with the theme of Journeys. Each Key stage 2 Year Group has been taking part in science during the week as part of their normal science curriculum but with a greater emphasis this week on investigations. Year 4 got messy investigating the functions of the digestive system. Year 5 planned an investigation

into which brand of trainer has the best grip and Year 6 looked at adaptations in extreme environments and created their own animals. Year 3 investigated the best reflective materials for a book bag.

Next week we have decided to hold a special science themed day to celebrate science week. Each class will spend the day looking at an aspect of science. Children will take part in cross curricular activities based around their chosen theme. Where possible, we have invited visitors to come and share their knowledge with the children. On Thursday morning we will be holding a special science assembly to launch our cross curricular science day.

This is our first ever Science day and we are really looking forward to it. If there are any parents who have connections or knowledge in areas of science, we would love to hear from you. There may be opportunities to use these in the future if it fits in to the National Science Week theme.



FABULOUS FRIDAY BATIK!

As part of their series of art workshops with Mrs Dunn and Mrs Trembath, the Year 6 children have been learning the technique of creating a picture using melted wax and fabric paint, otherwise known as batik. To begin with, the children had to design their picture on paper and choose the colours they would like to use before transferring their design on to fabric. This is a wonderful opportunity for our children to learn a technique that may inspire them to become textile artists in the future.

WRITE THE INSTRUCTIONS AND THEN TEST THEM OUT! - That is exactly what Year 6 have been doing this week! Having written a set of instructions on how to make pancakes, they then had to follow their instructions to the letter. Overall, a very positive result for each group with a few small hiccups that needed amending but they all got there in the end. Even the staff were called to test the end product and there were no complaints! A great way to learn why writing clear and accurate instructions really matter.
