ALL IN THE NAME OF SCIENCE! - Last week, the children had the most exciting day with real scientists spending the day sharing their knowledge and love for the very important work that they do. What a wonderful opportunity to inspire our children to become scientists of the future! See below for a report on the day from Isla Cameron (Year 6) and pictures showing the range of activities that took place. A huge thank you to all the parents and visitors for being so generous with their time. We really could not have done this without you!

This Thursday, we had a visit from three scientists who focused on three different areas of science. The first was a talk from a scientist called Jiaxin Chen who has only been in the country for two weeks! Nevertheless, she was happy to come and talk to us about her job as an engineer on the massive, self-driving ship called 'Pacific Vision'. It weighs 400,000 tonnes — the same as 14 million eight-year-olds! The ship doesn't need anyone driving it and can sense obstacles and weather changes. It was quite amazing.

Our second activity held by Dr. Ashton was based on wind turbines. We divided into groups and made our own thinking about what it would need to gain momentum. When we had finished building them, we tested how much electricity was being produced using a special piece of equipment. The winner generated 180v, followed by 125v and then 110v. It was really fun.

The final activity was an assembly from Mr Brown. He talked about air. He demonstrated lots of crazy things including making a ping pong ball float above a hairdryer and how to crush a can without touching it. He also balanced a glass of water on a tray with a string attached and swung it around his head without spilling a drop. There were lots of other tricks but my favourite was when he managed to dire a piece of potato at a target on the wall with a tube and the power of air.

It was a fun morning and I think everyone enjoyed it.

In the afternoon, Starlings looked at creatures that live in the Ocean. They had a visit from Dr Ben Holt (Marine Biologist) who brought in some rock pool creatures. The children drew scientific drawings of the creatures. In the classroom we researched other marine animals using fact cards and the Internet. We created a

display about ocean creatures.





SCIENCE IN KS1: In the morning we had a visit from Kim Butler, who told us all about eco bricks and we had a go at making some ourselves.

The scientist, Jiaxin Chen then came to see us to tell us all about her work. She also enjoyed listening to our Chinese New Year song, and watched the dragon parade. Then she wrote all our names for us in Chinese. We then went to Mr Brown's assembly and it was very exciting! Science is so much fun! In the afternoon we learnt all about Charles Darwin, then went on our own plant hunt around the school grounds. Such a busy and exciting day!
