On Saturday, 17th November, a large crowd gathered outside The Royal Oak Pub in Perranwell for the unveiling of the New Trafalgar Way Plaque. As the bugler sounded the alert, in the distance could be heard the sound of horses' hooves as the post-chaise made its way into the village via Cove Hill. On its arrival, Lieutenant Lapenotiere read the New Trafalgar Despatch, reporting the death of Lord Nelson, before presenting it to the Lord-Lieutenant. The bugler then sounded the fanfare and Lieutenant Lapenotiere remounted the Post-chaise as if to continue his journey on to London.

Luckily, for the spectators, the Post-chaise did not travel all the way to London, but returned a few moments later to allow for photographs and a closer inspection of the beautiful carriage.

A wonderful and most spectacular event to mark a very important historical event linked to our very special Perranwell village.

It was lovely to see several ex-Perran-ar-Worthal School pupils in their sea cadet uniforms guarding the plaque as part of their role for the day.
