
WE WILL MISS YOU!

AS SOME STAFF LEAVE, NEW STAFF ARRIVE! - This term we are looking forward to 5 new members of staff joining our team. See our new faces below!





GOVERNOR'S REPORT—SUMMER 2019

The summer term is very important in the work of the governing body. The first half of the term is concerned principally with the budget and the second focuses on the delivery of the school improvement plan.

Alarming stories abound concerning financial difficulties faced by schools elsewhere. Although increases in income have failed to keep pace with inflation in the last few years, the school remains relatively healthy financially, thanks to prudent budget management by governors and staff alike. Our approach includes the retention of sufficient reserves to enable us to cope with variations and unforeseen circumstances, and the financial outlook for this year and the next two financial years looks eminently sustainable.

In the second meeting in the summer term, governors received detailed reports on the recent results of the SATs tests for Swifts, the progress and attainment of pupils in all classes, the achievements of the school in relation to the objectives set in our school improvement plan and the identification of priorities for the forthcoming academic year.

It was especially pleasing to record the excellent educational progress of pupils, and this year – for the first time – governors received a report on the progress of every individual child. The data was anony-mized, so that we did see details of names, but governors wished to be satisfied that every child was making the very best progress possible. The results were excellent, and governors thanked the headteacher and all the staff for the effort that they had put into their teaching.

Another first was a face-to-face meeting between the full governing body and representatives of the School Council, who gave an admirably confident presentation on the work of the Council in what could have been quite a daunting situation. I hope very much that this meeting will be repeated in subsequent years.

And that's my cue to take my leave of you. Having been a governor for almost twelve years, it's time to move on. During my tenure, the school has grown and thrived and I have been delighted to play a part in that. I hope very much that the school continues to improve year by year. It should do. The culture of the school is firmly focused on improvement, the staff are first class and they are supported by an experienced, knowledgeable and thoughtful governing body. In other words, there is absolutely no reason why things should not get better and better. I sincerely hope they do and I would wish the school every success in the years to come.

One final comment: on a personal level, the experience of being a governor has been deeply rewarding, helped in no small way by the candour and sheer enthusiasm of Mrs Heffer, to whom I owe enormous thanks. It has been a privilege to see the work of the school close up and in detail. If you are thinking of becoming involved, I would commend it heartily. And what could be better than giving some of your time today to help educate and develop the citizens of tomorrow?
