SHARING FAMILY HISTORY – This week Mr Mark Teasdale came in to school to talk to the children about his family links with WW1. Mr Teasdale, who was in the navy, talked about his two Grandfathers who both fought in WWI and explained how his Dad's Dad (Robert) was in the Royal Navy and served on HMS Moon during the Battle of Jutland and his Mum's Dad (Bernard) was in the Army and fought in the Battle of Gallipoli. The children were mesmerised by Mr Teasdale's talk and were in awe of his grandfather's medals - a fascinating talk in preparation for a very significant day. As part of the commemoration of 100th anniversary of the end of WW1, don't forget to join the community at the village hall on November 11th at 2.30pm where there will be presentations from various groups in the community. Some of our Year 5 children will be presenting a short drama about WW1 as will the Carnon Downs Drama Group. There will also be some songs from the adult community choir and at **4pm** there will be

a moment of silence as the bells of St Piran's Church will ring out along with bells from all around the country. As part of the event to commemorate the centenary of WW1 there will also be an exhibition in the village hall that will run **from Wednesday 7 November to Tuesday 13 November.** There will be a range of exhibits on display including an exhibit from the school made up of painted poppies. As is done every year, there will be a gathering by the war memorial at 10.30am followed by a service in St Piran's Church. We hope to see you join us at some of these events.

LEARNING DETECTIVE GIVES OUR GOVERNORS A TOUR OF THE CLASSROOM – This week we have been visited by Mr Colin Bridges (Chair of Governors) and Mrs Philippa Laval (Community Governor). 
