FIRE DRILL PROCEDURE TEST - On Tuesday the school conducted its termly fire drill.



Every time a fire drill takes place the school aims to carry it out at a different time of day or when the normal structure of a school day may be different to the norm. This week, the staff were being tested on their fire evacuation register procedures. Mrs Heffer was hiding in her office with one of the junior Health and Safety officers to see if their absence at the fire point would be noticed, and I'm pleased to say the registers were checked quickly and the missing pair appeared unharmed. As if this little

test wasn't enough, Miss Braddon, one of our four trained Fire Wardens, deliberately blocked one fire exit with a 'pretend' fire (see picture) to test how staff and pupils would react. I am pleased to say that all pupils were taken safely and calmly to the next nearest fire exit and all arrived at the fire point quickly. Well done to all involved in following our procedures effectively.



The musicians, all of whom are still of school age, performed to an incredibly high standard. The orchestra performed a series of pieces which included:
