Milk: As parents of children under the age of 5 in Puffins will be aware, we have arranged for them to receive free milk at school, funded by the Government's Nursery Milk Scheme.

When children turn 5, parents have the option to pay for their milk to continue, and we have made arrangements with Cool Milk, to supply milk at a subsidised cost of 22p per day. This provision is available for all children at school – not just those in KS1.

If your child is 5 years of age or over, and you would like to order milk for him or her, this is what you need to do: Visit www.coolmilk.com and select "Register your child for milk here", then follow the on-screen instructions to register and pay. If you have any queries regarding your child's registration, please contact Cool Milk at customerservices@coolmilk.com, or telephone them on **0844 854 2913** and they will be happy to help. Payment and registration deadline is 5pm on a Tuesday for the following week. Any payments or registrations received after this point will then start the following week.
