SHINY NEW READING RECORDS – This week your child was issued with a brand new reading record. As these need to last the whole year and show an informative record of how often your child reads and what books they are reading, we have invested in stronger covers which we hope will ensure a longer life. These records are a very important part of your child's daily record of reading and it is expected that they will be looked after with care and brought to school every day where they will be checked by the staff. Any lost reading records will need to be replaced and these can be purchased from the school office for £1.20. For those parents who are new to our school, your child will move up a reading chart in their class every time they have been heard read at home. We award children for being heard read at home every day with team points. Last year, only a very small minority of pupils did not reach the top of the chart each week. This level of support from parents is greatly appreciated and we have seen clear evidence that this aids your child's progress in reading. If you have any further questions about the reading records or the reading charts, your child's class teacher will be happy to help.
