- 1. *Swifts: Year 6 Secondary transfers.* Please remember to submit your Secondary transfer application before the deadline of 31<sup>st</sup> October. For further information please speak with Mrs Read in the school office.
- Starting School in September 2017. If you have a child starting school in September 2017 please remember to apply for your place at school using the Cornwall Council website before the deadline of 15<sup>th</sup> January. An information leaflet is available from the main reception area.

Note: In a change to previous years, I<u>f your child has an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHC Plan) or</u> <u>Statement of Special Educational Needs (SEN)</u> you do not need to complete an application form as a school place will be identified through a separate process. Please contact the SEN Assessment and Provision Team for more information.
